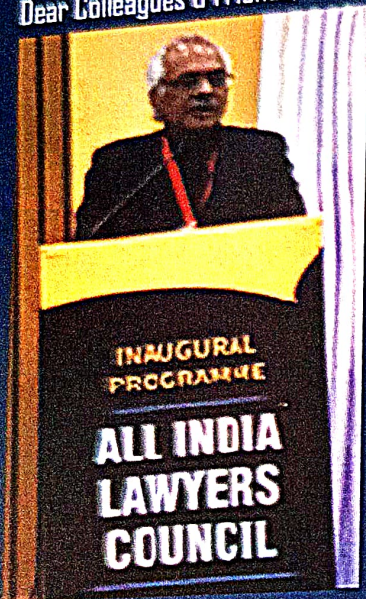

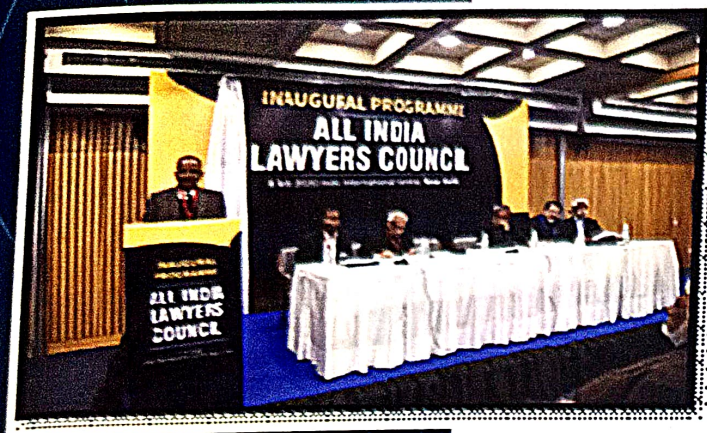

We have here, assembled in a very alarming situation when the foundation of our country, the Constitution of India is under severe attack by the existing government from all the sides. The politics is being molded in such a way that it is destroying the finer values of the democracy, plurality, rule of law and harmonious society. The state has been turned into an instrument at hands of capitalistic forces, the media reduced as propaganda machine promoting the anti-people programs of the government and hostility among various sections particularly between Hindus and Muslims. The well-established institutions of democracy are being torn apart from inside and outside both. The reason is being mocked at and the friction is being institutionalized at the place of scientific and analytical temper. The dissent and disagreement against the government policies and program is being branded as anti-national. Those who are still at feet to raise voices of conscience are being demonized, jailed and punished. The law of the land is being trampled by the people the power and at some places like Uttar Pradesh a police state has been made functional to deal with all those who still come forward to claim their rights guaranteed by the law and the constitution.

Even in case of about two dozen killings in UP alone in direct firing by the police no judicial inquiry as compulsory under section 176 Cr.P.C is instituted in gross violation of the law of the land. The notices to confiscate the properties without following the due procedure of law are being rampantly issued to Muslims and no action is in view against the destroying of properties, vehicles and torturing indiscriminate arrest. A reign of terror has been unleashed in furtherance of the threat of Chief Minister Badla lenge. The video clips of SSP Bijnor and SP Meerut are in public domain that is samples of the mentality and strategy of police in Uttar Pradesh. Hordes of unemployed youth under indoctrination are deployed to create havoc, anarchy, hatred, violence, communalism and other criminal acts. The police personnel themselves had openly replaced the right years where it is seen to destroy the household properties and vehicles entering into peaceful localities. The notices to Muslims to confiscated their properties without following due process of law is are issued and arrest is indiscriminately made to terrorize the people with possibility to oppose the draconian laws like CAA-NPR-NRC and about 6000 persons were detained alone in Uttar Pradesh and threats are looming large for thousands more for further arrest, furthermore at some places when households are looted by the police they were also asked to vacate their houses and migrate from India.

Legal fraternity in contemporary time has again been put at a test to take up the cudgels on behalf of the oppressed, needy and victimized people. The lawyers had always been putting themselves at front of every fight against injustice and authoritarianism. They have won in the fight during freedom movement and they are further required to involve themselves to strengthen and restore the inclusive, secular and democratic idea of India delivered to us by our forefathers after a long struggle.



In the open session a large number of participating Advocates from various states freely expressed their views on current affairs and the conspiracy afoot to weaken the Rule of Law and democracy in the country which is apprehended to be entrapped under un-Indian fabric following tenets of fascism and urgently needs more activism from every shade of professionals particularly from legal fraternity. It is stressed upon by every participant that there is urgent need for formation of common platform, hence the 'All India Lawyers Council' (AILC) is formed with unanimous decision of all participating Advocates attending this meeting.

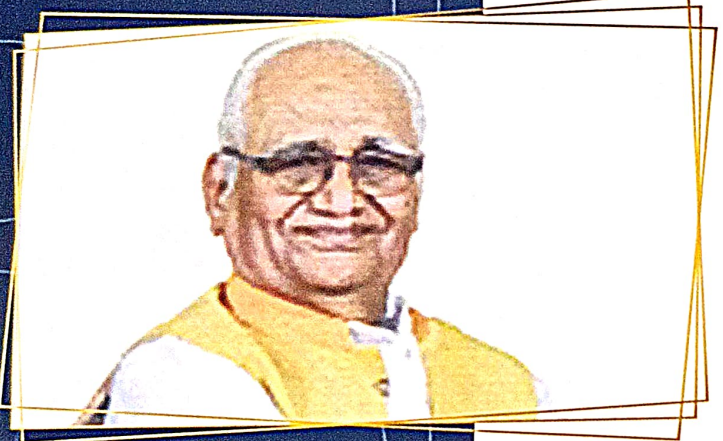


At last of session, a Central Committee comprising of thirty one members was unanimously elected giving representation to the most of states of the country participating in the session.

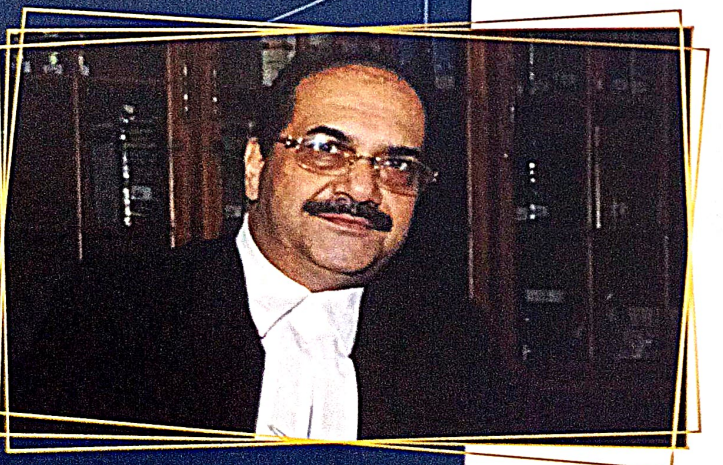
The session of the Council also delegated the powers to the newly elected Central Committee to deliberate and finalise the aims and objects of the Council and to get registered with appropriate authority.

Since this government assumed power, undemocratic actions and highhandedness have become a norm. It was unprecedented that the then four sitting Judges of the Supreme Court of India held a press conference and flagged the countrymen that the democracy was in danger. The Director of CBI was unceremoniously removed at 2 o'clock at night by sending a contingent of 400 security personnel so that he might be stopped from investigating the Rafael deal. The sealed report of Comptroller and Auditor General of India was produced by the government in Rafael case before the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court relied upon it while it was not even in existence in legal parlance.

ACTIVITIES REPORT

CONSPIRACY AFOOT TO REPEAT MUZAFFARNAGAR OF 2013 AT NOOR PUR

A delegation of All India Lawyers Council (AILC) consisting of Advocate Sharfuddin Ahmad, Secretary General, Advocate Farman Ali, Mahender Singh, Amir Khan and Faizan Khan, visited Noor Pur on June 9, 2021.

Noor Pur is a village, newly designated as Town Area Tappal in Aligarh district. A Jat-dominated area having eighty percent Muslim and twenty percent Dalit population. According to Dalits, there has occurred no communal incident in the village for last four decades. The social compatibility is evident from the combined demography. Muslims had donated a piece of land and also contributed to Dalit brethren to construct an Ambedkar Dharmshala.

The village, due to Muslim population, happened a hit point for mischievous elements, operating from Tappal for creating trouble. An insignificant incident took place on May, 26 when Muslims asked to postpone the operation of loud music/DJ at the gate of a Masjid for ten minutes for Namaz-e-Asr. Verbal shots were exchanged between youths. An unidentified person damaged a side glass of the DJ vehicle. Wiser and elderly people intervened to solve the issue. After prayer, the marriage procession was resumed and two marriages were solemnised. There remained no controversy till next day when a known person followed by others from Tappal visited Dalits of Noor Pur and instigated Omprakash alias Omi to register a criminal case against Muslims. It took two days in persuasion as a section of local Dalits didn't like the idea but political pressure and ulterior motives prevailed to lodge an FIR on 28 May in Tappal Police Station naming eleven Muslims, five of whom were arrested.

In a premeditated conspiracy, a Dalit village boy was hired for writing on the walls of Dalits' houses to demonstrate insecurity among Dalits. A concocted narrative was released to Hindi media and published in daily Amar Ujala in all its editions and other newspapers. BJP leaders from outside, including the Mayor and the MP of Aligarh, situated at a distant of 85 km, started visiting Noor Pur issuing provocative and communal statements. An outsider from Aligarh, Nazm Ali, a self-claimed office-bearer of a political party, also added fuel to the fire. The ill-intentionally controversial and fake points are as follows:

- (1) Horse riding of the bridegrooms were forcibly stopped by Muslims. Actually, there was no horse or horse riding on the occasion or at any event before. The whole narrative was cooked up,
- (2) There are three masajid but Muslims don't allow Dalits to raise a temple in village. Actually, Dalits themselves had thwarted the move of the RSS conspirators to install Lord Hanuman idol at Ambedkar Dharmshala.

(3) Dalits are forced and lured to embrace Islam. Actually, Dalits informed that there is not an iota of truth in the allegation and there is no such complaint from any Dalit. Three years back, one Dalit, out of his free will, reverted to Islam, following due procedure and, he has been steady since then.

It was revealed from local interactions that same persons who engineered the trouble in Noor Pur are local wine mafia, creating menace of a high scale. They are deeply connected to the ruling establishment. Hundreds of persons have died in the area due to poisonous drink. The sufferers are mostly labourers. Some arrests were made to divert the heat. Noor Pur was selectively picked to engage the Administration and the Police and to brew a big trouble like that of Muzaffarnagar in 2013, generating hate and violence for failure of BJP in West UP.

Huge money has been pumped in to repeat the false narrative and to raise a Hanuman temple in the village.

There is no sign of abnormality in Noor Pur, though the PAC is camping in the Ambedkar Dharmshala. Bonds have been taken from two hundred Muslims and more than fifty Dalits to ensure peace. The villagers appreciate the role of the Police and Administration in dealing with the situation..

Appeal to philanthropists to help kin of UP teen who died due to police assault

Hyderabad: Zahid Ali Khan, Editor of Siasat Urdu Daily and Mtekhkar Hussain, Secretary of Faiz-e-Aam Trust appealed to philanthropists to help the family of a 17-year-old boy, Faisal who had died in Uttar Pradesh after being beaten up for "violating" the COVID-19 curfew in the state. Fact finding report of the incident

A delegation of AILC led by Secretary General Advocate Sharfuddin Ahmad visited the bereaved family of Late Faisal Hussain on 27th of May, 2021. Late Faisal was brutally killed in daylight on 21st May, 2021 by the policeman, Constable Vijay Chaudhary in complicity with other policemen in Bangarmau, District Unnao, Uttar Pradesh. Faisal, 19 years old was only earning hand of the family dealing in retailing of vegetables at the pavement of the vegetable market situated nearby his residence. Late Faisal's family had been traditionally been small time retailers of vegetables. For the last 10 years, father of Faisal, Islam Hussain has been suffering with acute asthma and other diseases so has been fully incapacitated. The elder brother of Faisal namely Sufiyan also suffers from Filariasis and blurred eyesight. The younger brother Ayaan is only 14 years old so the entire financial responsibility of the family was on Faisal who in view of the constraints, had to take the vegetables from the wholesale traders in the morning on credit and after sale use to pay back in the evening keeping the earned balance with him to run the family.

A constable namely Vijay Chaudhary had unleashed a reign of terror by committing brutality on hawkers and pavement sellers to exploit them financially since his posting as constable in Police Station, Bangarmau. On 21st of May, when Vijay Chaudhary came to the market other people, selling vegetables and miscellaneous items fled away but Faisal was caught and brutally beaten thereafter, forcibly taken to police station by Constable Vijay Chaudhary and his colleague on Motorbike. He was done to death by beating in police station in the presence of SI and other policemen. The video of the incident in this regard has been widely circulated. The delegation has gathered the information as following:

The only bread winner of the family has been done to death by policemen, FIR was registered and three of them have been arrested.

The family has been suffering with penury, helplessness but no financial aid on the death of promising boy Faisal has been provided by the government or any other organisation till now.

Most of the members of the family are suffering with in capabilities and diseases. Married sister has also been expelled from the husband's house from last 3 years and the burden is on the family of Late Faisal.

The family lives in a delapidated room in a house shared by the members of the extended family. No member of the family of Faisal is educated or capable to earn the money to bear the necessary expenses of the family.

The delegation of AILC was comprised of Mohammad Saleem Khan, Organising Secretary of U.P. SDPI, Mr. Haroon Rashid and Yunus Siddiqui from Kanpur in addition to Sharfuddin Ahmad Advocate.



What family of the victim say?

The incident had taken place on Friday in the Bhatpuri locality in Unnao district's Bangarmau when the boy was selling vegetables outside his house.

The boy's family alleged that he was caught by a constable for allegedly violating the 'corona curfew' and thrashed with a stick. He was later taken to a police station, where he was again thrashed following which his condition deteriorated and he was rushed to the Community Health Centre, where he was declared dead, the family alleged.

He was beaten up in front of the inspector in-charge, the boy's family alleged.

After the incident, officials informed that two Police constables and a homeguard have been charged with murder of the boy.

All India Lawyers Council (AILC) Team consists of Adv Sharfuddin Ahmad, the Secretary General, Adv R Sevikan Parkh, Vice President and others with a purpose to gather first hand information made a visit on 14th of September 2021 to the family of Late Sameer at town Banat in District Shamli in UP. The news of occurrences of lynchings, fake encounters, malicious arrests and prosecution of Muslims are commonly noticed daily. But the killing of a 20 year Muslim boy in such a place with temerity is very alarming when a few months are left for the elections. It is reported that goons belonging to Bajrang Dal are deployed to attack innocent Muslims and the youth under Hindutva dose, indoctrinated with hate and violence are used to unleash a reign of terror among Muslims, Dalits and other vulnerable people. The killing of Sameer manifestly seems a result of conspiracy of terrorising Muslims as community. It is amply reported in the locality that there existed no personal cause of action of heinous attack on Sameer for any individual ground. It is also a fact that there are inimical feelings in neighbourhood as in Muslim dominated locality Hindu families coexist harmoniously and peacefully for generations. The town has a record of amicable relations between the communities. Muslim population is only 1/3rd still muslims had been elected the chairman of town area more than once.

It is noteworthy that

Eight years after Muslim cleansing from a number of villages of Muzaffarnagar and Shamli, at the eve of UP Assembly elections, new pitch of communal battle is being dangerously laid by invisible forces but the parties happened the same as of 2013, all the attackers are Jats and unfortunate victim, losing the life belongs to the most deprived section of Muslims.

Sameer 20 years has just completed his training as a mechanic and only two months before he had joined Tata Sales and Services at Shamli. He was relieved early from the job with a purpose to open his Bank account to draw his first salary on 9th of September. In the evening at 6 o'clock, he was caught hold by a gang of Jat youths near Bus stop of Banat at a distance of three km from Shamli and criminally assaulted from all around after identifying him a muslim boy. He was forcibly picked putting him upside down, the attackers turn by turn smashed his skull to the road till he lost his consciousness. Some people came to rescue and rushed on autorickshaw to local government hospital in Khudana at a distance of 5 km but there it was advised that injuries are grivenous and the injured be taken to hospital in Muzaffarnagar. The relative including Adil, uncle of Sameer, other relatives and neighbours accompanying injured Sameer with a view to fastly procure first medical aid rushed to private practitioner Dr. Khurseed Alam who after examination declared the injured Sameer dead.

Late Sameer was the only bread earner for the family. He had geared himself up in his early age to bear the responsibility of the family as his father had expired when he was only 17 years old and got himself trained as Mechanic to shoulder the responsibility of the fatherless family. The family left behind him has four members, a widow mother, an eighteen years old sister to be married and two younger brothers studing in class 10 and 7 in the college.

The bereaved family after death of young Sameer has no means of income. The family has no property to subsist. No Official of the Government has visited the family of late Sameer nor any financial aid to the family has been delivered or declared by any agency of the government or individual and organisation. The family is passing through very pathatic situations after death of only earning hand. There is urgent need of immediate help to the family on compassionate ground.

FIR was lodged for the incident by the Uncle of deceased, Adil on 10th September 2021, naming eight accused persons. Three accused persons have been arrested till now by the Police. Five accused persons named in FIR are still roaming free.



UTTAR PRADESH - KANPUR

Kacchi Basti

Kacchi Basti in Barra-8, Kanpur is an area of hutments grown up as a habitation of people below poverty line or who couldn't afford a permanent and regular house. Out of hundreds only a dozen of Muslim families live scattered in small make-shift abodes made mostly of the plastic sheets. There has never been any caste or communal issue as the most families living in the same conditions in neighborhood and separated only by identification of their names as Hindu or Muslim. Quresha Begam, a Muslim and Rani wife of Ramesh, a Scheduled caste Hindu had been acquainted for last twenty years since the days, both were neighbours in erstwhile locality and on suggestion of Rani, the family of Quresha shifted to neighbouring place of Rani some years back. There arose some dispute between grown up offsprings of two families who are engaged in driving battery rickshaws. There happened altercation and legal action between of late due to the bad blood.

On August 11, there occurred a dispute due to a scratch of battery rickshaw between the erring families at a time when a promotional procession in support of Jagran (religious awakening) was being organised by affiliates to Sangh.



BIHAR, ADHARPUR (SAMASTIPUR), AUGUST, 2021

AIRC sent a central team led by Advocate Sharfuddin Ahmad, the and other local leaders of Bihar alongwith leaders of AIRC Vice President Sevilam Parithi (Tamilnadu), Vice President Adv Khwaja Javeed Yusuf (West Bengal) Adv Haider Ali (Jharkhand) Adv Santosh Jadhev (Maharashtra) Adv Amir Khan (Bihar) and Mr. Firoz Alam to study and make analysis of the aftermath and effects of the communal engineering of Sangh on the population of Muslims in District Samastipur in Bihar. In a day, three persons, one woman and two men were killed. Sarwan Yadav was shot dead before dawn at the tea stall in the village. Noboy could site the killer due to invisibility.

There happened, as reported, a recent feud between Sarwan and Hasnain on account of the laying of public road leading in front of house of Sarwan. A day before the serial killings, Sarwan Yadav used JCB machine to forcibly remove the part of the construction of the raised road near his house that had been completed by Hasnain under the contract with government authorities. There were reportedly amicable relations between both the persons before the dispute arisen regarding the road. Hasnain is locally a well-known figure and also wielded influence in the village. He is sitting Deputy Mukhia and had been elected Mukhia twice earlier.

There are only seven houses of Muslims in the locality of Adharpur mostly close relatives of Hasnain. As the news of killing of Sarwan spread, people started gathering from the village and by 10 o'clock, an huge crowd of outsiders with saffron gamchas around necks had poured in and around the spot of occurrence from all around chanting communal and provocative slogans against Muslims.

It is reported the crowd was premeditated with plan and started indiscriminate attack on all the houses of Muslims. Mrs Sanowar Khatun, 45 years, the wife of Hasnain was forcibly pulled out from her house caught by hair. She was made bared of her all the clothes and nudely paraded in public. The woman was thereafter taken to an enclosure and repeatedly was sunk with her head into water. Eye witnesses reveal that her breast was cut off with sharp weapon and heavenly tortured till her death. The mob continued the violence for whole of the day without any intervention of the Police and before evening the indoctrinated goons had set to fire, looted and razed to ground all seven houses of Muslims killing a woman and man and grievously injuring a senior citizen.



Anwar, aged 30, a nephew of Hasnain was caught by the violent mob and he was also brutally done to death on the spot applying all the means of torture and indignity. The Muslim women including daughters of Hasnain, sneaked into the house of Pasi neighbour who in exceptional situations ensured their safety but the mob did not spare the infirm and aged father of Hasnain, causing him grievous and deadly injuries. The police shifted him in unconscious state to the hospital where after

Several days, he could be restored to the consciousness.

The area has recently witnessed visible presence of Bajrang Dal. They hover over the streets and roads with saffron gamchas to make their presence felt and openly engineer hatred against Muslims with impunity.

SDPI had organised very huge protests against the injustice, engineered and perpetuated on sheer and collective hate against Muslims. Three culprits have been arrested by the police but the leading among them are still not brought to book due to political pressures

The continuing sore of pathetic incident is the family of Anwar left after the death of only bread earner for entire family. Deceased Anwar had left behind him a young wife Nusrat Jahan and four minor children, three daughters aged 9, 7, 5 years and only son 3 years old. They have been given refuge to a destitute family of father in law of Anwar. The family doesn't have even a permanent roof over the head. The essential articles for household or even clothes for children are still beyond the reach of the bereaved family. They urgently need compassionate aid from the community. It is unfortunate that the Nitish government has not provided help.

AILC DEMANDS MAGISTERIAL ENQUIRY INTO THE MURDER OF RAHUL KHAN

New Delhi, 23 December, 2021: A delegation of All India Lawyers Council visited the house of Rahul Khan, a 23-year-old married youth, brutally killed on 13 December in Rasoolpur village, district Palwal, Haryana on 22 December. Deadly beating by three goons continued, chanting communal words, to make explicit the cause for the fatal assault on Rahul Khan. They themselves made a video of their action that was leaked or broadcast on 16 December in social media. A named FIR was lodged by the father of the deceased.

Chiddi Khan, the father had retired in April from the post of Khalasi, a petty employee of Indian Railways. A migrant from remotely rural area, Chiddi Khan had lived throughout his life with his family in a rental house in Rasoolpur where his other in-laws were residing. His work place was nearby. Craving to have his own house, after retirement he spent all his post-retirement funds and savings to purchase a piece of land to construct a house in Sarai Khatila, a village, 15 km from Rasoolpur. The entire family shifted to the newly-built house on 13 December, leaving behind his only son, Rahul Khan and his wife, Shahina, to join the family the next day. In the evening, Kaluwa, a friend for last two years came to meet Rahul and invited him for an outing. Rahul is said to have declined saying his wife was alone, but Kaluwa persisted Shahin to let Rahul accompany him for fifteen minutes only to meet some common friends. As it was the last day in the village, Shahina allowed Rahul Khan to leave with Kaluwa. Rahul Khan didn't come back thereafter ever. After waiting, the local police was informed about the disappearance of Rahul Khan. Next day, the relatives came to know from Kaluwa that Rahul was injured in a road accident. A cousin, Mohammad Yusuf rushed to the house of Kaluwa, who misbehaved and threatened Yusuf. Later on, more relatives rushed to the house of Kaluwa where Rahul was found lying in a very bad shape, in a pool of blood, without any clothes, bearing grievous injuries on every organ of his body. He was shifted to the hospital by the relatives in a semi-unconscious condition. He could not sustain the injuries and died at the hospital.

A video clip was noticed on social media on 16 December where three youths Om Pal alias Kaluwa, Vishal Bhatnagar and Akash Prajapati alias Diljale, all the residents of Rasoolpur were seen causing grievous injuries repeatedly, shouting with every stroke that Hum Hindu Hain Aur Tum Miyan, Rahul Khan had been taken to an isolated spot at the nearby canal and the crude violence was perpetrated by the three goons under a premeditated plan. It is a matter of investigation in what situations, a badly-injured Rahul was shifted in the dead of the night from the alleged spot of assault to the house of Kaluwa. Rahul was a mechanical engineer who was deployed by his father to help him in construction of house. Even after a week, no proper investigation was done. The eye witness of last seen, Shahina, the widow, has not been approached by the Investigating Officer to record her statement under Section 161 Cr.P.C. Government officials have neither visited the bereaved family nor are any ex-gratia financial aid declared or provided. No community organisation has come to help the victimised family. The old-aged Chiddi Khan has lost the only bread earner of the family. His two daughters are married and live with their families. Chiddi Khan has no property except a meagre income from his small pension.

As usual, a counter narrative is developed after every incident in cases of targetted killings of Muslims, Dalits or Tribals, by way of caste, communal or collective violence, projecting the victim as contributor to the offence. This strategy of assassinating the character of victims is common in every case of violence against innocent people to provide a cause of abetment to the offenders and an excuse for the majoritarian violence.

Palwal district is part of the vast Mewat region spread in states of Haryana, Rajasthan and a small part of UP. The whole Mewat, till recently, was purposely kept devoid of government schemes of development. No irrigation projects, no higher educational institutions and no employment avenues, Mewat was made one of the most backward area of the country. Mewat has a sizeable Muslim population sans civic facilities. The infamy of Mewat is communally identified and fabricated issues are given unproportionate publicity. Local issues are falsely introduced to the outside world as foreign funding to build Masajid with unaccounted money. The fake issues of love jihad, the social discretabilty of the population, etc are issues of the media glare.

Mewat has borne with a number of cases of mob-lynching since BJP formed the government. The case of Rahul Khan may be the latest one but not the last one, in view of the chequered history of the area.

Amongst others there emerged following subtle and moot points in the case of Rahul Khan who was brought to the hospital alive:

- 1) Whether the hospital had followed the due procedure for the dying declaration in view of critical condition of the injured person.
- 2) Whether the offenders are affiliated to any organisation.
- 3) Whether the killing is caused to execute a communal agenda by indoctrinated elements and whether the offenders are politically connected.
- 4) Whether Kaluwa is a habitual offender having a criminal history.
- 5) Whether the police and the hospital has acted fairly and timely.

A Magisterial Enquiry may urgently be ordered to ensure justice to the bereaved family and also to strengthen the Rule of Law with a view to check and control the repetition of such crimes in the area.

MALEGAON (MAHARASHTRA)

Mumbai, January 10, 2022: A two-member team of the All India Lawyers Council (AILC) comprising of the Secretary General, Sharfuddin Ahmad, advocate, Supreme Court and Adv. Santosh Jadhav, National Secretary visited Malegaon on January 7, 2022 to study the facts and circumstances of Malegaon which was badly hit with violence after a call for a protest on 12 November, 2021, given by the Raza Academy and other organisations. A day's protest was called in to put the shutters down (bandh) against communal violence of Tripura as well as the hateful and violence-provoking speeches and actions targeting Muslims, Christians and other vulnerable sections of the society allegedly by known and indoctrinated goons.

The AILC has prepared a fact finding report after the visit and brought it to the public domain so that just, adequate and corrective measures may urgently be applied to restore the confidence of people in the administration of justice. The press conference was addressed by former Justice of Mumbai High Court, Mr. BG Kalse Patil, National Vice President, AILC, Advocate Sharfuddin Ahmad, Secretary General, AILC and Adv. Santosh Jadhav, National Secretary, AILC. Presenting the following Report:

All India Lawyers Council (AILC) sent a delegation of lawyers to Malegaon to find out the actual facts and ground realities relating to the incidents of 12th of November, 2021 as well as the circumstances thereafter. AILC's team in three days visit dt 7, 8 & 9 of January 2022 has collected the information about the violent incidents relevant to the public importance.

The "Bandh" call for 12th of November 2021 was given by the Raza Academy and supported by almost all the social, political and religious organisations of Malegaon in view of the recurring communal, hateful and violent incidents as the governments, specially the BJP ruled states have not controlled the habitually criminal elements openly flouting the rule of law.

The meetings of the visiting team in Malegaon were held with the local representatives of various organisations as well as with the leading individuals. The team of AILC also had a look at the spots of occurrences and the demography of Malegaon.

The facts emerged after wider interaction with local residents is as follows:

1) After the call of the protest by the Raza Academy, it was unanimously decided by the representatives of various organisations only to observe the protest in a form "Bandh" against lawlessness by making an appeal to shutter down the total work in the city for a day on 12th of November which happened Friday. As on Friday, the markets in Malegaon generally remain closed.

2) Only hundreds of people assembled at the crossing "Shaheedon ki Yadgar" and a Memorandum was handed over to the Official purported to be sent to the government in the morning as per prescheduled programme.

3) In view of the rising tempers and the atmosphere getting volatile, the Raza Academy had to withdraw its call and it appealed to the public to stay away from the meeting and the March. The leadership of the Raza Academy and the leaders of other organisations as Jamait e ulmae Hind, NCP, Congress, Janta Dal (S) etc thereafter, disappeared from the scene resulting to a vacuum into leadership of protesting crowd.

4) After Friday prayers, mob had gathered and started a march to Shivaji Circle, a point or the end of Muslim population. The police Officers are said to have made phone calls to a number of local leaders to intervene and to stop the march being held leaderless but according to police version, the most of the phones of the local leader who had supported the Bandh, were found switched off.

- 5) It is revealed that the protest had peacefully ended and the most of people had started dispersing to leave to their homes.
- 6) Surprisingly, Just at the end of the program, it happened instantly that a bandh of 20-25 people concealing their faces with clothes emerged from the opposite direction and shouting slogans started indiscriminate and violent attacks on properties.
- 7) The most of properties damaged in the violence on 12th of November 2021 are owned and possessed by Muslims. No property of any non-Muslim has been damaged during this spree of violence.
- 8) The attackers according to local people were unknown outsiders in hidden faces and none of them was arrested by the Police.
- 9) It is also informed by the local people that about two days before the declared protest, trollies full of sharp- edges stones were unloaded near the spot of the incident and these stones were hurled and pelted on the police during the disturbance to make the police force to use force.
- 10) Six FIRs were registered by the local police in two Police stations and more than sixty persons are named and other one thousand to one thousand and five hundred(1000 to 1500) people have been made un-named accused persons in about half a dozen criminal cases registered by the Police.
- 11) The police made allegations to have been injured during stone pelting and the use of fire arms is also alleged. The injuries allegedly caused to policemen are said at the non-vital parts of bodies and hardly grievous in nature.
- 12) The police version is that complete footage of CCTV had been procured but no such footage is made available in public domain.
- 13) It is found from the perusal of FIRs that same persons are mentioned in several cases with an apparent purpose to increase the number of cases as well as to manifold the difficulties of accused persons so that they may be devoid from civil liberty for a long time.
- 14) It surprising that incidents had allegedly taken place at distant places but registered against the same persons without any credible evidence against them
- 15) The majority of the accused persons have very clean credentials and have never been ever prosecuted in any criminal case.
- 16) The identification of actual offenders in view of the availability of the CCTV footage may lead the police to file the charge sheet as a large number of persons had already been arrested.
- 17) About two months' time has passed but the police has squarely failed to file charge sheet in any case against any accused person incarcerated in the jail.
- 18) Indiscriminate arrests are said, to have been made including of some passers- by who had coincidentally happened at the way at the time of incident and were caught by the police on the fateful day. They have all been lingering into jail without any of their own fault.
- 19) A reign of terror has percolated rooting to every Muslim family of Malegaon. The reports are doing the rounds that an exorbitant income has grown up in view of the apprehension to every Muslim resident for the arrest keeping in view a large number of unnamed accused persons are mentioned into FIRs lodged by the police.
- 20) Malegaon had unfortunately suffered with incidents of two bomb blasts in the year 2006 and 2008. A large number of innocent people were then rounded up and had gone through pangs of pain for a long time. Now extra safeguards are required so that innocent persons may not further suffer. social atmosphere of Malegaon.



2) Muslims of Malegaon had unjustly been treated in past so keeping this in view, a liberal treatment be given as these persons have been in jail custody for two months and non-filing of the charge sheets the police is prolonging the incarceration worsening the social atmosphere of Malegaon.

AILC FERVENTLY DEMANDS TO THE MAHARASTRA GOVERNMENT TO FORTHWITH CONSIDER:

A) That the expunging of names from the cases may be directed regarding all the accused persons in FIRs arrested by the police but not spotted in CCTV footage being prima facie, the innocent persons.

B) That the government may direct to the police either to release the accused persons on personal bond or not to oppose the bail applications of those who are not visible in footage of the CCTV procured by the police.

C) That the police may be directed to release the footage of CCTV to public so that the actual culprits may be identified and innocent people may not be harassed further.

D) A judicial enquiry may be ordered by the government to instil confidence, to deliver a speedy justice and to boost up the morale of the people in view of larger interests of entire population of Malegaon.

Appeal to help widow of mob lynching victim Intezar Ali

Editor of The Siasat Daily Zahid Ali Khan, Secretary of Faiz-e-Aam Trust Iftakhar Hussain, and Maqdoom Mohiuddin of Bibi Amena Multi Speciality Hospital have appealed to philanthropists to help the widow members, a widow and her three children, who are left with no source of income are in urgent need of financial aid. Editor of The Siasat Daily Zahid Ali Khan, Secretary of Faiz-e-Aam Trust Iftakhar Hussain, and Maqdoom Mohiuddin of Bibi Amena Multi Speciality Hospital have appealed to philanthropists to help the widow as much as possible as the widow has a lot of responsibilities including the educational expenses of three children, legal expenses, etc.

Migrant from Moradabad

The victim Intezar Ali was a migrant from Moradabad, UP, and had no other income except his earnings. The family lives in a rented tenement made of tin. The deceased has left behind a widow, Firdaus (36), son Asif (12), and daughters, Asia (9), and Shahida (7).

Firdaus still did not receive a copy of the postmortem report. All India Lawyers Council (AIRC) has assigned its state leader, Adv. Ahad Adhikari to render all legal help. His efforts have resulted in the arrest of six accused persons of mob lynching while the remaining seven are absconding till the filing of this report.

No financial aid received so far

No financial aid from the government or any voluntary organization has been given to the destitute family. The victimized family desperately needs care and support. Though, the AIRC has arranged all the legal help yet financial aid for the studies of minors and family expenses is urgently required.

On May 24, 2022, the AIRC team met the bereaved family and collected the facts related to the lynching of Intezar Ali. The team consisted of Advocate Sharfuddin Ahmad, Advocate Santosh Jadhav, Ali Inamdar and Advocate Ahad Adhikari.





What actually happened?

Intezar Ali who was engaged in the transport business was said to be taken by three-four persons for an assignment on May 6, 2022, from his house, room no. 2, Anas Chawl, Bohin Compound, near Kurmura Bhatti, Shil Diva Road, Shyphata, Kausa Mumbrah. On May 7, he was found lying on the roadside in the market of Mangaon in Raigarh district about a hundred kilometers away from his residence in a very critical condition as deadly injuries had been caused in various parts of his body in an act of mob lynching. The local police has brought him to the hospital where it is said that he succumbed to his injuries. The cops on May 8 approached the widow Firdaus for the identification of the body of the deceased. On the same day, FIR was lodged against thirteen persons for mob lynching.

FIR Factual and critical report regarding No. 24 / 2023 Police Station Gopalgarh District Bharatpur

Dated 20.02.2023 at 11:00 A.M. On the instruction given by the General Secretary of the organization All India Lawyers Council Central Committee, Senior Advocate Janab Sharfudin Saheb, a delegation of All India Lawyers Council Rajasthan, in which State General Secretary Mr. Naeemuddin Akil Advocate and State Secretary Mr. Ikramullah Khan

Advocate and State Secretary Meenu Verma Advocate, went to village Nuh. In Haryana, Junaid and Nasir were burnt alive in village Ghatmika, district Bharatpur, Rajasthan and authorized to send the factual and critical report related to the incident along with photographs and videographs to Central Committee AIRC as soon as possible.

All the above members expressed their inability to go with the delegation due to unavoidable and personal reasons, on which the above three members of the delegation arrived at around 03:30 PM in vehicle number RJ14- YC. 3292 left from the court complex Jaipur metropolis with the driver Mr. Arif Khan and reached Kama district Bharatpur at around 09:30 p.m. and contacted the local resident Janab Noor Bhai. Chitranjan Marg, C- Scheme jaipur - +91 93146 56420

Whose arrival time is around 10:30 P.M. But reached the village Ghatgika Tehsil Cama District Bharatpur and met the victim family and eminent people of the village and consoled the victim family and after getting the information related to the case, the latest facts came to know that a press note has been issued by the Superintendent of Police, District Bharatpur. which is attached to the report. In Case No. 24/2023, the accused Rinku Saini has been arrested in Police Station Gopalgarh and the said accused has been sent to PC for 5 days. Remand has been taken. In which the accused during interrogation has told about the involvement of 8 persons in the incident, about whom research is going on. The post- mortem of the charred skeleton has also been

conducted by the Medical Board. The DNA of those who have biological relation with the deceased Junaid and Nasir by the Forensic Medical Board. Samples have been taken, whose reports are yet to come and three teams of Bharatpur Police are working with Haryana Police to nab other absconding accused and suspects.

The monitoring of the said episode is going to Bharatpur by Inspector General of Police, Bharatpur Range Shri Gopal Srivastava and Superintendent of Police, District Bharatpur.



RAJASTHAN



On 21.02.2023, after the police remand of 5 days was over, the accused along with the local advocate and P.C. The suggestion was given by the delegation and all the lawyers who are appointed to get justice for both the deceased should work with one opinion. To ensure this, the delegation asked, and while getting the statements of the witnesses in the investigation, it was suggested to keep your lawyer with you and to be in constant contact with AILC Rajasthan and AILC's national unit for all possible legal help. Accused Minku Saini's P.C. The remand was given till 21.02.2023, which was extended yesterday on 22.02. Will be produced before the court from police custody on 2023.

At around 12:00 A.M. in the above village, the family members of the deceased and eminent persons of the society meditated deeply for about one and a half hours. Departing from village Ghatmika, the delegation arrived at 01:30 A.M. But stopped at the restaurant near Alwar to have food and from there the time was 02:00 A.M. Leaving at 04:00 A.M. But the District Court Complex reached Jaipur metropolis.

JHARKHAND

Haider Ali... On Monday, 15th November, 2021, a Fact Finding Team of All India Lawyers Council (AILC) of Jharkhand Chapter visited the family of Enamul Ansari and Nanhu Ansari (deceased) in Brambe village and Sursa under Mandar Police Station, Ranchi.

The Ansaris were brutally murdered in jurisdiction of Nagri Police Station and a case was registered against unknown persons, corresponding Nagri P.S. Case No. 185 of 2021. The Fact Finding Team comprised of Adv. Haider Ali (State In-charge AILC), Adv. Waizur Rahman (President, AILC), Adv. Sarfaraz Akhter (Treasurer, AILC) and Adv. Fidaur Rahman (Executive Member, AILC). The Team found that the Enamul Ansari and Nanhu Ansari were murdered by notorious criminals Babloo Khan, Saddam, Amit Kumar Verma and Tony Lohra, who have already been apprehended by the police and have confessed their crime. The Team assured their family for free legal aid for justice.

AILC GUMLA, JHARKHAND VISITS THE FAMILY OF THE VICTIM OF MOB -LYNCHING, LATE SHAMIM ANSARI

All India Lawyers Council Jharkhand sent a delegation to visit Raikera Bandh Toli village, Gumla district in Jharkhand on 11 May, 2022 to collect facts of the mob-lynching of Shamim Ansari that occurred on May 6, 2022 in a forest area. The late Ansari was a known figure and had been president of a forest protection village committee formed by the Forest Ranger to help protect the Wildlife and to control forest theft.

Late Ansari was killed in a pre-planned manner by the forest mafia involved in forest crimes that considered him to be a hindrance in the execution of their illegal activities. The delegation of AILC found out that Mr Ansari had sacrificed his life to serve the public cause under the authority of Government Official, but even after his ultimate sacrifice, no visible aid was provided to the bereaved family by the Jharkhand Government.

The delegation of AILC comprised of District Office-Bearers, including the District President, Advocate Khurshheed Alam and the District Secretary, Adv. Monasha Baxla who gave a memorandum to the District Authority demanding to bring the culprits to justice and to provide financial aid to the family.

AILC District Gumla pledged to extend every legal and moral assistance to the family of the victim. It is shocking that concerned citizens rendering voluntary service to their government duty are not taken care of even after the ultimate sacrifice. AILC repeats the demands made in the memorandum dated 6/5/2022 by AILC Gumla.

The Central Committee of AILC appreciates the pioneering role of its Jharkhand unit.

AILC, JHARKHAND, RANCHI

On 12 June, 2022 at 10:30am, a fact finding team of AILC Jharkhand comprised of Advocate Waizur Rahman, President, Haider Ali, General Secretary and Adv. Sarfraz Alam, treasurer, rushed to the house of a victim felled day-before-yesterday and met members of the family of the deceased Shahid Ansari and Modassir Alam who were shot dead by the police and Hindu goons on 10/06/2022, while protecting for the arrest of Nupur Sharma and Mawin Jindal. It has been revealed from the statements of eye witnesses and the viral video clips that both innocent young boys were shot at

directly and at point blank by the police and the Hindu goons.

Shahid Ansari's father had already registered an FIR. The AILC team helped the father of late Modassir in drafting and lodging the FIR. The team also contacted the injured persons who were under treatment in RIMS namely:

- (1) Md. Sarfraz, 29 years, (2) Kaifi, 26 years, (3) Nadeem Ansari, 24 years, (4) Shahbaz Ansari, 26 years, (5) Md. Tabarak, 24 years, (6) Md. Shahil, 24 years, (7) Md. Sufiyan, 22 years, (8) Sabir Ansari, 28 years, (9) Md. Usman, 17 years, (10) Md. Tabarak, 18 years, and (11) Md. Afsar, 25 years, and assured of free legal help by the AILC from lower court to the Honourable Supreme Court for delivery of justice.

Najid Khan... A delegation comprising of AIRC State Committee President Advocate Hariram, Deputy president Advocate Shailaja Amarnath, State general secretary Advocate Ashraf Agnady, State secretary Advocate Ansar visited the residence of deceased Dinesh at Belthangady of Mangalore district of Karnataka, who had died due to brutal murder committed by members of a local outfit, Bajrangi Krishna. The delegation paid condolences to the family of the deceased, met the Superintendent of Police of Mangalore district and demanded strict legal action against the culprits.

The AIRC delegation assured of extending any legal help to the bereaved family.

TAMIL NADU

Sharfuddin Ahmad Sir: AIRC Tamilnadu presented a representation through Adv Lakshmi Raja, the State Secretary and other members before the Police Commissioner, Chennai, demanding immediate ban on the release of communally-mischievous film "Anti Indian" (Tamil Movie) scheduled to be released in the year 2021.

The movie allegedly found to be based on religious controversy reflecting intellectual violence upon a certain religion adversely for casting and degrading the moral values of Islam and also apprehended to create a bad blood between Hindus and Muslims.

The AIRC Tamilnadu arose to the occasion and moved a representation to ban the movie which was banned. The timely and bold intervention on behalf of the AIRC is an example of the relevance of the Organisation.



THE AILC IN FURTHERANCE OF AIMS & OBJECTS HAS MAINLY BEEN ACTIVE IN FOLLOWING MATTERS:

- AILC Jharkhand filed a Writ Petition in the High Court seeking impartial enquiry for the communal violence where Police has killed the youth.
- FIR was filed against Deepak Tyagi aka Yati Narsinghanand Saraswati, a self-claimed Sadhu of Daasna, Ghaziabad who is a champion of spewing venom, communal hate & violence.
- FIR was filed against Kajal Hindustani who threatened to demolish religious places using JCB in Gujarat.
- AILC filed a Writ Petition at the High Court of Delhi challenging the release of a movie "The Conversion" because of its communally biased content. The movie scheduled on 8th of October, has not been released.
- AILC is providing Legal Aid to the families of victims of communal violence belonging to Samastipur, Kanpur, Shamli, Godhra, Hazaribagh, Unnao, Delhi & Kasganj, Haryana. All victims fell to caste & communal violence.
- AILC is also contesting the case in the Supreme Court of India against economic reservations for jobs diluting the constitutional provisions.
- AILC has also been intervening in Supreme Court in the case of CAA-NRC-NPR.

In view of stark failure of the Government of Uttarakhand to take proper action against the culprits, a protest was held outside Supreme Court using derogatory Language and expressing no confidence in the Apex court.

- AILC has sincerely taken up the issue and has started proceedings to file contempt petition in the Supreme Court against those persons who dishonored the Rule of Law and the highest court of the country
- AILC Tamil Nadu State Secretary, Adv. Laxmi Raja timely rushed to convince Police Commissioner to withhold a film release apprehended to cause religious animosity.



VISITS OF AILC



The Teams & delegations of AILC have visited several spots of violence to collect the information on actual facts with the purpose to provide legal help in the investigation & prosecution such as;

- Shamli (Uttar Pradesh)- family of Sameer who was killed by the Hindutva extremists to terrorize whole Muslim community of that region.
- Kanpur (Uttar Pradesh), where Ashraf was mowed down by running over a car and AILC has opposed the bail application of the accused person, pending in High Court Allahabad.
- Godhra (Gujarat), in which a person died in the police custody stage managed a case of suicide.
- Bangarmau (Unnao), a 19 year old boy was killed by a policeman in broad daylight.
- Kasganj (Uttar Pradesh), a 20 year old boy was picked alleging his involvement in elopement of a girl and died in police custody repeating the same story as presented in the Godhra case.
- Delhi, Maulana Umar Gautam, incarcerated in a false case.
- Dahod in Gujarat when a deaf and dumb girl was kidnapped.
- Ahmedabad village Undhela, Khara where Muslims were flogged publicly and submitted memorandum before the officials.

Mumbai All India Lawyers Council sent a team to collect the actual facts of the lynching of Intezar Ali Muddi Ali Sheikh, aged 37 on 24th of May, 2022. And to meet the bereaved family to Mubarah at the outskirts of Mumbai.

West Bengal in its meeting dated 23rd Feb, 2022 expressed its grave concern in the matter of unnatural death of Anisur Rahaman Khan, a student of Aliah University age about 28 years.

Delhi AILC has registered a strong objection against the raids by Delhi Police on the lawyer's chamber of Adv. Mahmood Pracha on 24th December, 2020 and 8th of March 2021. The lawyer has been appearing in some cases in Delhi riots of Feb, 2019. AILC reiterated the settled view that the sanctity of the chamber of a lawyer should be honored being an extension to the Court premises.

AILC held a press conference in Press Club India that was jointly addressed by the Vice President, Hon'ble Justice Mr. B.G. Kolse Patil (Rtd) and Adv. Sharfuddin Ahmad, the Secretary General of AILC.

1. Name of the Organization: All India Practising Lawyers Council/All India Lawyers Council (AILC).
2. Registered Office: The office of the Organization shall locate in the National Capital Territory of Delhi, having its jurisdiction and activities throughout India, at present is at the following address:-
A-15 Hazrat Nizamuddin West, Backside, Ground Floor New Delhi- 110013
3. Aims and Objects: The Council (All India Practising lawyers council) or All India Lawyer Council (AILC) is mainly formed to provide legal help to all the needy, helpless or oppressed persons and victims of violence, hate, inequality and injustice and also to protect the basic structure of the Constitution as well as the values and rights mandated by International Covenants and Treaties. The Council shall be committed to strengthen the rule of law by bringing together practising advocates to the defense and promotion of civil rights and liberties, irrespective of differences in political and economic inclinations and practice as well as irrespective of variance in birth, caste, creed, colour, gender, region, or religion.
 - a) To uphold, protect and promote principles of constitution by way of legal and public interventions throughout India.
 - b) To undertake constant review of penal laws and the criminal procedure with humane and liberal principles;
 - c) To work in relation to protection of Advocate who represents his client and also to give representation to advocate fraternity and raise voice before all constitutional authorities.
 - d) To encourage participation of women, differently abled marginalized or weaker section in the profession of advocacy.
 - e) To ensure freedom of expression and independence of thought, to work in relation to promotion of legal education within the legal fraternity and outside the legal fraternity.
 - f) To undertake a constant review of penal laws and the criminal procedure with a view of bringing them in harmony with human and liberal principles;
 - g) To secure the rule of law and independence of the judiciary; to work for the withdrawal and repeal of all repressive and draconian laws including preventive detentions;
 - h) To make legal aid available to the poor; to make legal assistance available for the defence of civil liberties; to work for the reform of the Judicial system so as to remove inordinate delays and eliminate inequities;



- i) To bring about prison reform, to oppose police excesses and the use of third degree method, and also to oppose police discrimination on the ground of religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth, as well as to combat social evils that encroach on civil liberties, such as untouchability, casteism, and communalism;
- j) To defend in particular the civil liberties of the weaker sections of society and of women, transgender and children;
- k) To encourage participation and admission of students of weaker sections in National Law Universities;
- l) To conduct seminar, workshops, conferences, annual lectures for enhancement of legal knowledge with the group members.

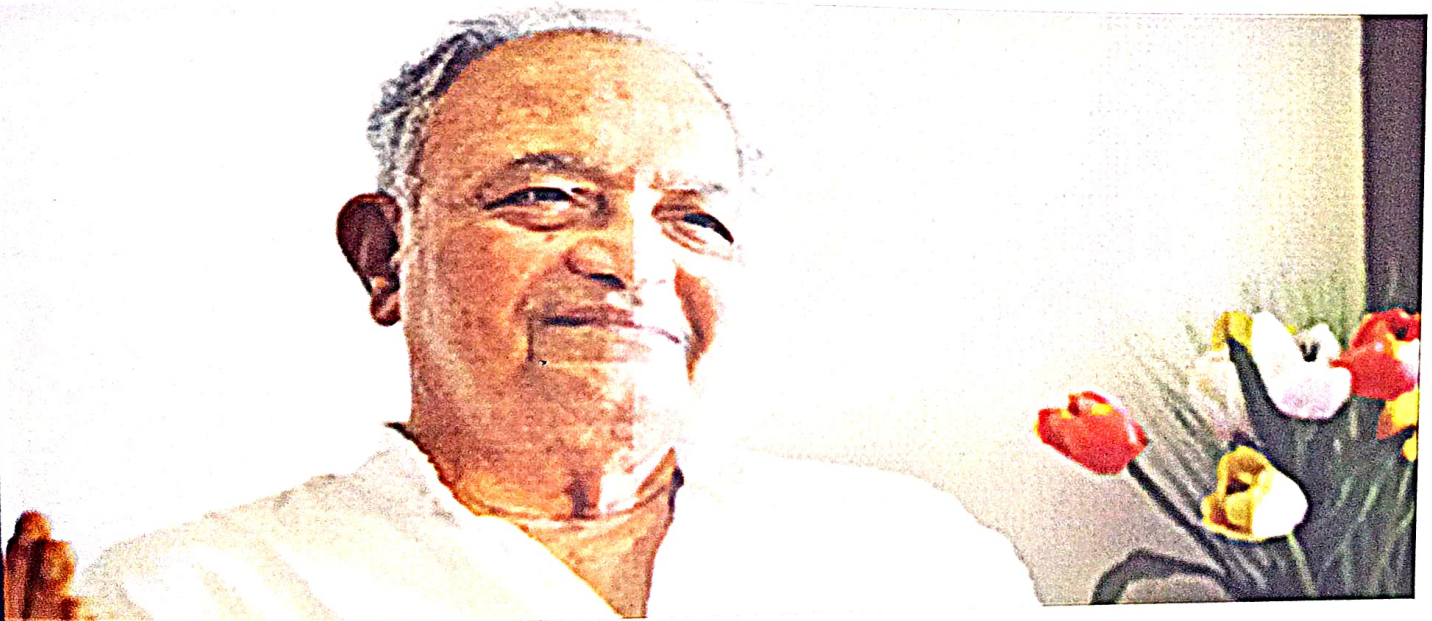

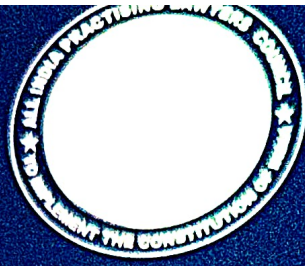

RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. Name of the Council : All India Practising Lawyers Council / All India Lawyers Council (AILC)
B. Membership defined : A practising advocate enrolled with any State Bar Council in India may, by application or nomination become member of All India Practising Lawyers Council (AILC) hereinafter referred to as 'the Council' or 'the AILC'.

C. Admission and qualification for membership : Any application of new membership may be recommended by a member supplying, copy of enrolment certificate of State Bar Council with full details of his/her practice and place in an approved format. The membership shall be operative only after the acceptance by the state unit and be final only after the confirmation by the Central Secretariat.

D. Subscription of the membership : Rupees 100 for registration. Membership fee will be Rs. 500 per year or as decided will be collected annually.

E. Appeal and re-admission of Membership

: If any application for membership is rejected by the state unit or any re-admission of membership is sought, it would be duly considered by the Central secretariat or its Committee. The Central Secretariat have further right by a two-third majority to refuse membership to any person or to remove any person from membership. Against the decision of the state unit, if a person is not satisfied, an appeal against decision of the Secretariat may be preferred to the Central committee.

F. Right and privileges of membership

: The Council shall bear the expenses incurred in discharge of functions specifically assigned to any member in accordance with the approved parameters of the Council in this regard. Any function carried out by any member shall have to take a pre-financial approval from the authority empowered for this purpose

1. CENTRAL COUNCIL (GENERAL BODY)

General body defined: All the members of the Council shall constitute a general body which in accordance to convenience, may be represented by electing delegates from various state units under an established procedure by the Central Committee to provide fair and democratic representation to all the state units proportionate to the number of members of the state.



2. CENTRAL COUNCIL:

A. MEETING:

Every meeting of the council shall start with the Pledge of the Council. The meetings of the general body shall be held after every three years with a quorum of 100 members of the Council. No quorum shall be required in the adjourned meeting. An emergent meeting of the general body may also be summoned on the written request of 1/3 members of the Central Committee. However, the meeting of Central Council shall require no condition of quorum in the adjourned meeting. In every three years, there shall be election of the Central Committee in meeting of Central Council. The following business shall be transacted in these meetings:-

- i) To present a report of the previous functions of the Council.
- ii) To prepare an annual program and policies.
- iii) To pass annual budgets of the Council.
- iv) To discuss and to decide all such other matters and issues that are directly or indirectly related to the affairs of the All India Practising Lawyers Council.

v) To appoint an auditor who will annually inspect the accounts of the Council.

B. FUNCTIONS

- (i) The Central Council is constituted by the existing Central Committee members and State Committee members of all the states.
- (ii) The Central Council will meet at least once in three years. If demanded by two-third of the members Central Council, a meeting may be convened within one month of such a notice.
- (iii) The Central Council will review the functioning of the organization on the basis of the working report placed before it by the Central Committee
- (iv) The Central Council will elect the Central Committee for the period of three years.
- (v) A quota from every state shall be fixed by the Central Committee to send delegates to the meeting of the Central Council. Through a separate scheme to elect the delegate/members to Central Council
- (vi) The Secretariat at the respective level shall be a steering committee of the Council at that level being accountable respectively to the Central, State or District Committee as the case may be, led by the General Secretary.

3. CENTRAL COMMITTEE

There shall be a governing body (Central committee) of the Council to look after and to manage the day - day affairs of the Council. It shall consist of minimum 11 and maximum 55 members including the office bearers. The quorum for the meeting of the Central Committee will be one third. There shall be no condition of quorum in case of the adjourned meeting of the Central Committee. An emergent meeting of the governing body (Central committee) may also be summoned on the written request of 1/5 members.

The following business shall be transacted in these meetings:-

- a) To take necessary steps for the implementation of all the programs and policies drawn by the general body.
- b) To pass the necessary expenditure to meet the day to day requirement of the Council.
- c) To take all such steps for smooth management of the Council and the betterment of the Council in furtherance of Aims and Objects.
- d) To approve the required amendment to the Memorandum of the Council proposed by the Central Secretariat.
- e) The state President /the General Secretary may, having no voting right be called to the meeting of the Central Committee by the Secretary General.



- f) The purposes below may be brought to the Central Committee by the Secretary General for the due implementation.
- g) To confirm the appointment of the auditors, office secretary and such other staff members of Council and to fix their salaries, allowances, gratuities and other privileges within the sanctioned budget and to define their powers and duties and to suspend and dismiss or dispense of with their services in accordance with Rules and Regulations of the Council.
- i) To consider and approve the amendments to the Rules and Regulations of the Council as when deemed necessary.
- ii) To invest and deal with any funds of the Council not immediately required in such manner, as it deems fit.
- iii) To open and operate Bank Account in the name of President or Secretary General, Treasurer or separately.
- iv) To appoint Authorised Signatories for the operation of the Bank account of the Council.
- v) To do all such business aimed at increasing the image and popularity of the Council and to further the cause of the Council.
- vi) To appoint sub committees for smooth running of the affairs of the Council recommended by the Central Secretariat.
- vii) The nomination of a patron the Council recommended by the Secretary General.
- viii) To frame Bye - laws, make addition and deletion into the Rules and Regulation of the Council.
- ix) To make nominations as required in the central as well as state committee of the council.
- g) Central Committee shall take decisions by majority of members present and voting. In case of equality of votes, the President /the Chair shall have right of a casting vote.

THE FOLLOWING IS THE PRESENT STRUCTURE OF THE GOVERNING BODY / CENTRAL COMMITTEE:

1. President, 2. Vice President, 3. Vice President, 4. Vice President, 5. Vice President, 6. Vice President, 7. Secretary General, 8. Secretary, 9. Secretary, 10. Secretary, 11. Secretary, 12. Secretary, 13. Secretary, 14. Treasurer, 15 to 50 Members.

4. STRUCTURE OF THE COUNCIL:

The Council will have various committees as detailed below:

A) CENTRAL COMMITTEE

- (i) Central Committee is the national level committee to govern the functioning of the organization. The Central Committee is the ultimate decision making body of the Council. It has powers to vote out any decision of the lower bodies of the Council.
- (ii) The Central Committee is elected by the Central Council for a Period of three years. State President shall be ex-officio member and the state General Secretary, special invitee in the Central Committee, if not elected members. The ex-officio members as well as special invitees shall have no voting rights.
- (iii) The Central Committee is constituted by minimum 11 and not more than 55 members.
- (iv) In addition, the Central Committee may nominate members to the committee provided, the total number of nominated members does not exceed one third of existing elected members.
- (v) The Central committee shall elect members of Central Secretariat among its members.
- (vi) Central committee will elect the Central office bearers from its members.
- (vii) Central Committee shall be convened at least once in every six months. If demanded by two third members shall be convened within a month of such a notice, In emergency, the meeting may be called by Secretary General on 7 days after the notice.



(viii) The following shall be main functions of Central Committee:

- a. To discuss and decide on the policy of the Council.
- b. To formulate programs of the Council.
- c. To supervise the administration and financial matters of the Council.
- d. To elect Central Secretariat and office bearers.
- e. To call for reports of performance from the state committees.

(ix) Central Committee shall nominate any person of eminence as patron for the purpose of the Council on the proposal of the Secretary General.

(x) The Central Committee may delegate any power on its behalf to the Central Secretariat of the Council.

B) CENTRAL SECRETARIAT:

The central secretariat is steering committee to function at behest of the central committee.

(i) The Central Secretariat is constituted by minimum 5 and not more than 13 members including President and General Secretary to be elected by the Central Committee from among its members for the running of the routine affairs of the organization. The Central Secretariat has to meet at least once in three months or as called by the Secretary General or on requisite of three members by the President.

(ii) The Central Secretariat shall perform all the functions on behalf of the Central Committee subject to post approval of the Central Committee of the council.

(iii) The Central Secretariat may invite or involve patron/patrons to programs or task carried out by the Council as the special invitees. In addition, the Central Secretariat may nominate members to the Central Secretariat provided the total number of nominated members does not exceed one third of existing elected members apart from the special invitees, time to time to be invited by the central secretariat at the discretion of the Secretary General.

(iv) The Central Secretariat may from a Sub Committee for its help among members as outsource any matter to expect for the any opinion.

C) PATRONS:

(i) Patrons may be nominated permanently by the Central Committee of the Council exploring and seeking the overall promotion from the respected persons acknowledging the honour and recognition in their respective fields on the recommendation of the Secretary General of the Council.

(ii) The Patrons shall be selected among the former judges, retired police officers or bureaucrats, renowned intellectuals, social activists and political leaders. The patrons may be invited to guide the Council to carry on activities and to advise on the current and important issues. The meeting of Patrons may be convened as resolved at the time and place as decided by the Central Secretariat. Any principle of quorum to the attendance shall not be applicable to the meeting of the Patrons. The advice of the Patrons shall be put before the Central committee for the final approval and actions. A Patron or Panel of Patrons may be selected by a Central committee to conduct or supervise and complete the process of elections of the Council. Patrons may be requested to be part of a delegation or commission, constituted by the Council for a specific purpose or any task or responsibility for on behalf of the Council. The Patrons may be invited by the Secretary General to any meeting of the Council as special invitees.



D) STATE COMMITTEE:

- (i) Members of the Council of every state shall constitute a state committee elected by State council.
- (ii) The State Committee is constituted by minimum 11 and not more than 21 members elected by the State Council for a period of three years.
- (iii) The State Committee will elect State office Bearers.
- (iv) The District President shall be ex-officio members in the state committee if they are not elected members.
- (v) In addition to elected the state committee may have nominated members not exceeding one third of the existing elected members.
- (vi) The State Committee will plan the activities for state level activities subject to approval by the central committee, if funds are required.
- (vii) State Committee meetings shall be convened once in four months. If demanded by two third members or directed by the Central Committee it shall be convened within 10 days of such a notice.
- (ix) The State in charge shall function as representative of the central committee as a special invitee to the state committee.

E) STATE SECRETARIAT:

- (i) The State Secretariat is constituted by minimum 5 and not more than 7 members including President and General Secretary elected by the State Working Committee from among its members.
- (ii) The State Secretariat is the sub-committee of the State Committee appointed for the running of the routine affairs of the organization. The State Secretariat has to meet at least once in two months.
- (iii) In addition, the State Secretariat may recommend the names for the nominated members to the State committee provided the total number of nominated members does not exceed one third of the existing elected members either of State committees. Such nominated members have full powers as elected members.

F) STATE COUNCIL:

- State Council shall comprise all the members procuring membership of the Council and are practising lawyers in the state.
- (i) State Council may recommend a name to the Central Committee for nomination as patron of the Council from the respective state.
 - (ii) State Council is constituted by the State Committee members and the District Committee members from the respective states.
 - (iii) State Council will meet at least once in three years. If demanded by two third of the members. State Council meeting shall be convened within one month of such notice. The Central Committee may direct to hold a meeting of state committee, if required.
 - (iv) State Council will review the functioning of the organization in the state on the basis of the working report placed before it by the State Committee.
 - (v) State Council will elect the State Committee.

G) DISTRICT COMMITTEE:

- (i) The District Committee is constituted by minimum 7 and not more than 15 members elected by the District Council for a period of three years.
- (ii) The District Committee will elect the District Office Bearers.
- (iii) The Branch Committee President shall be ex-officio members in the District Committee, if not elected member. The ex-officio members shall have no voting rights.



(iv) In addition, the District Committee shall nominate members to the committee provided the total number of nominated members does not exceed one third of the existing elected members.

(v) The District Committee will plan and program for district level activities.

(vi) District Committee meeting shall be convened once in two months. If demanded by two third members, it shall be convened within 30 days of such a notice.

(vii) Any committee elected below the district shall work under guidance the district committee.

H) DISTRICT COUNCIL:

(i) District Council is constituted by the district committee members in the District and the central committee as well as state committee members belonging to the respective district.

(ii) The District Council will meet at least once in a year. If demanded by two third of the members District Council meeting shall be convened within one month of such notice.

(iii) District Council will review the functioning of the organization in the district on the basis of the working report placed before it by the District Committee.

(iv) The District Council will annually elect the District Committee for every year.

I) BRANCH COMMITTEE:

Every city or town having a civil, criminal or revenue court or tribunal may have a Branch of the council under the territorial jurisdiction of the respective District Court. The Branch Committee may have a President, Vice President, Joint Secretary and Treasurer for only an year with members of an Branch Committee. The annual election of Branch Committee shall be conducted by the General Secretary of the District Committee.

J) OFFICE BEARERS:

Every Committee except Central Committee shall have elected office bearers as follow.

1. President one
2. Vice President (not more than 2)
3. Secretary General one
4. Secretaries (not more than 3)
5. Treasurer one

5. POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICE BEARERS:

1. President -
 - a. The president shall preside over all the meetings of the committees and the programs of the council.
 - b. The president at all levels in the structural hierarchy shall supervise the activities of the Council.
 - c. He shall have the responsibility for the growth and development of the organization under the jurisdiction.
 - d. He shall along with Secretary General be representative of the Council.
- a. The Vice President at all levels in the structural hierarchy shall assist the President and undertake the responsibilities delegated to them by the President or the committee, he is vice President.
- b. In case of absence of the President from the routine functions, the President can appoint a Vice President as in-charge as one of the Vice President shall be assigned the functions of the President in his absence.



3. GENERAL SECRETARY

- a. The General Secretary at all levels shall look after the general administration of the Council.
- b. The General Secretary shall maintain the records and accounts of the Council and may be assisted by one of the secretaries specially assigned for the purpose.
- c. The General Secretary shall be responsible for public relation on behalf of the Council with individuals as well as with other individuals and organizations.
- d. The General Secretary at the Central level shall have nomenclature of the Secretary General.
- e. The General Secretary shall communicate as central representative of the Council.
- f. The General Secretary may delegate powers to any other Secretary for the time being at his discretion.

4. SECRETARIES:

- a. The Secretaries shall assist the General Secretary.
- b. In case there is no provision for General Secretary at a particular level, the Secretary shall assume the powers and duties of the General Secretary.
- c. In case there is more than one Secretary, the concerned Working Committee can decide about the work distribution among them. The Central committee may assign specific work to any state secretary.

5. TREASURER:

- a. The treasurer shall be responsible for mobilizing and keeping the record of the funds.

6. QUORUM FOR THE MEETINGS:

The quorum of meetings of all Committees except Central meeting shall be 50% of the total members of the Committee. In case a meeting of the Committee is not held due to the lack of quorum, there will be no need of quorum for the adjourned meeting of the respective Committee.

7. FINANCIAL YEAR:

The financial year of the Council shall be from 1st April to 31st March every year. However, the first financial year shall be from the date of registration till 31st March 2021.

8. SOURCE OF INCOME:

The source of income of the organization will be the following:

1. Subscription from Members of the organization.
2. Donations from members well-wishers.
3. Properties of the Council/ All the funds collected at any level other than Central Committee has to be remitted to the State Committee. Each State Committee has to remit a prescribed percentage of their annual income to the Central Committee. The organization accounts at all levels below State committee shall be audited every year by the auditors appointed by the concerned State Committees. The accounts of State and Central Committees shall be audited by the auditors appointed by the Central Committee.



9. REGISTER OF MEMBERS:

The Council shall have an office to keep registers of members setting forth names, addresses, place of practice and domicile pertaining to each member of the Council, the changes of membership taking place from time to time shall also be recorded.

10. BANK ACCOUNT:

a). The funds of the Council shall be kept in a Scheduled Bank. The bank accounts shall be operated the President, Treasurer and General Secretary individually and independently or as decided by governing body.

b). The State Committee, at demanded, may open separate account into the scheduled Bank after approval by Central Committee. The audited annual report of such an account of the State Committees will timely be submitted before the Secretary General of the Council for the finally annual audit the State President and General Secretary be liable and accountable for the transaction made in State Accounts of the Council .

11. ELECTION:

a) The governing body of the Central Council shall be elected for a term of three years in the general body meeting. The State Council for three years and District Council for one year.

b) The secret ballot system shall be the mode of election.

c) The elected members of the Council shall be eligible for re-election.

d) Where the Council fails to conduct election of the members of Central Committee, the Central Register shall hold the election within a period of ninety days from the date when such election became due.

e) No person shall be eligible to be elected in any committee except patron unless he is a member of the general body of the Council by the election or nomination.

f) An elected members of a Council, who has acted adversely to the interests of Council may on the basis of a report of the respective committee or otherwise be removed by resolution of the Central Secretariat passed at meeting by a majority of not less than two-third of the members present or voting at the meeting, provided that the member concerned shall not be removed unless he/she has been given a reasonable opportunity of making a representation in the matter and approved by the Central Committee.

12. DISCIPLINE:

The leaders and members of the organization shall uphold the ethical values and refrain from all kinds of vices.

(I) In case a member is charged with serious violation of discipline, the National President and the State Presidents may take appropriate disciplinary action including suspension based on credible report and such forwarded to Central committee for confirmation.

(II) A member can be suspended by the President below the level of State on the basis of the report from the subordinate committee subject to endorsement by the respective committee in the next meeting for a period not more than one month and before the expiry of this period the matter has to be decided by the State President.

(III) In case of members of State Committee or Central Committee, the matter has to be decided by the Central Secretariat and finally by the Central Committee.

(iv) A disciplinary committee of the Council may be formed by the central secretary including the members of the Central Committee and Patrons selected by the Central Secretariat. The Central Committee shall be the final authority to approve /disapprove the decision of the disciplinary committee.

(v) The findings of the disciplinary Committee shall be brought to the Central Secretariat in every matter. The Central Committee shall have final authority on behalf of the Council to approve, disapprove or modify the recommendations of the disciplinary Committee.



13. RESIGNATION:

(I) The resignation of a member who is not an office bearer has to be submitted to the Branch President and the final decision has to be taken by the District President.

(II) In case of a Committee member above the level of Branch and below the level of State, resignation as a Committee Member or office bearer has to be submitted to the President of the respective Committee. The matter has to be finally decided by the District Committee. If the member under the question is a member of State Working Committee or Central Committee, the resignation has to be submitted to the respective President and the matter has to be finally decided by the respective Committee and be final after the approval or disapproval by the Central Committee.

14. APPEAL:

There shall be the right of appeal to the next higher level in all disciplinary actions. An appeal against any disciplinary action shall be submitted to the next higher authority within 30 days of the communication of the decision.

15. SBC ELECTION

No member or office bearer of the AILC shall be authorised candidate for the election of the State Bar Council till his candidature is considered by the respective state committee and confirmed by the Central Committee. The Central Committee may also propose a name of the member to be Candidate for the election of any State Bar Council or Bar Council of India.

16. Rules:

The provisions under the heading of Rules and Regulations are approved by the Central Council of All India Practising Lawyers Council (AILC) or All India Lawyers Council and duly made part of the official record of the Council.
